Title of document: Further Proposed Changes to the Proposed Submission Core Strategy Development Plan Document (DPD)

Subject matter of and area covered by the document:

The Oxford Core Strategy sets out the spatial planning framework for development within the City of Oxford up to 2026, and is the key document in Oxford's Local Development Framework. Oxford City Council has produced a set of Further Proposed Changes to the Regulation 30 submission Core Strategy DPD. These changes are required as a result of legal challenges to the South East Plan relating to the South of Oxford Strategic Development Area. For the purposes of this consultation exercise, the starting point is the April 2009 version of the Core Strategy known as the Proposed Changes to the Submission Core Strategy.
