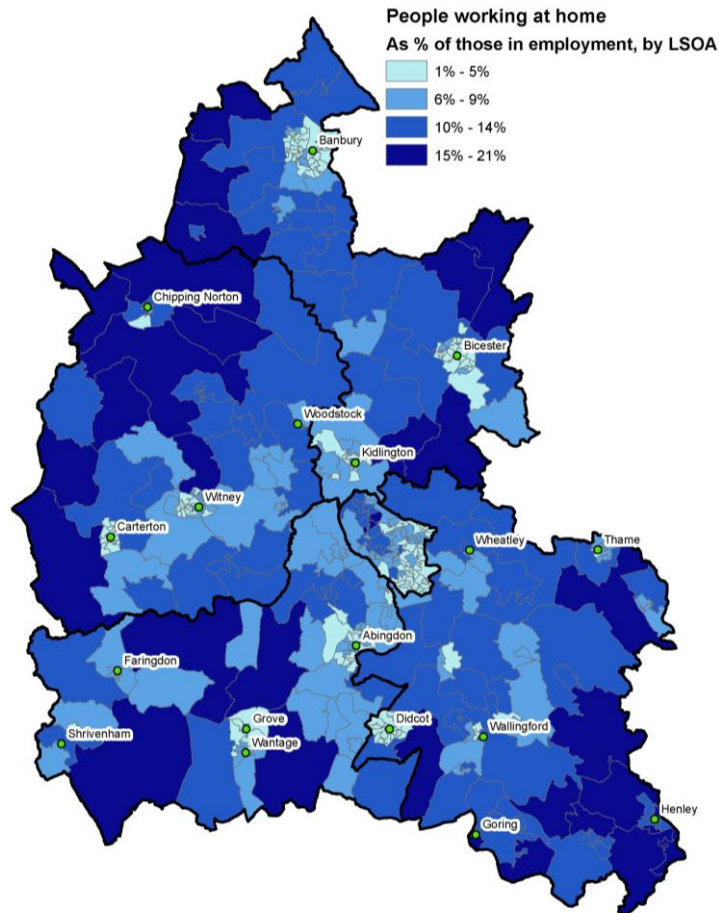


## Mapping of Census 2011 data shows areas with higher rates of home working and self employment in rural Oxfordshire

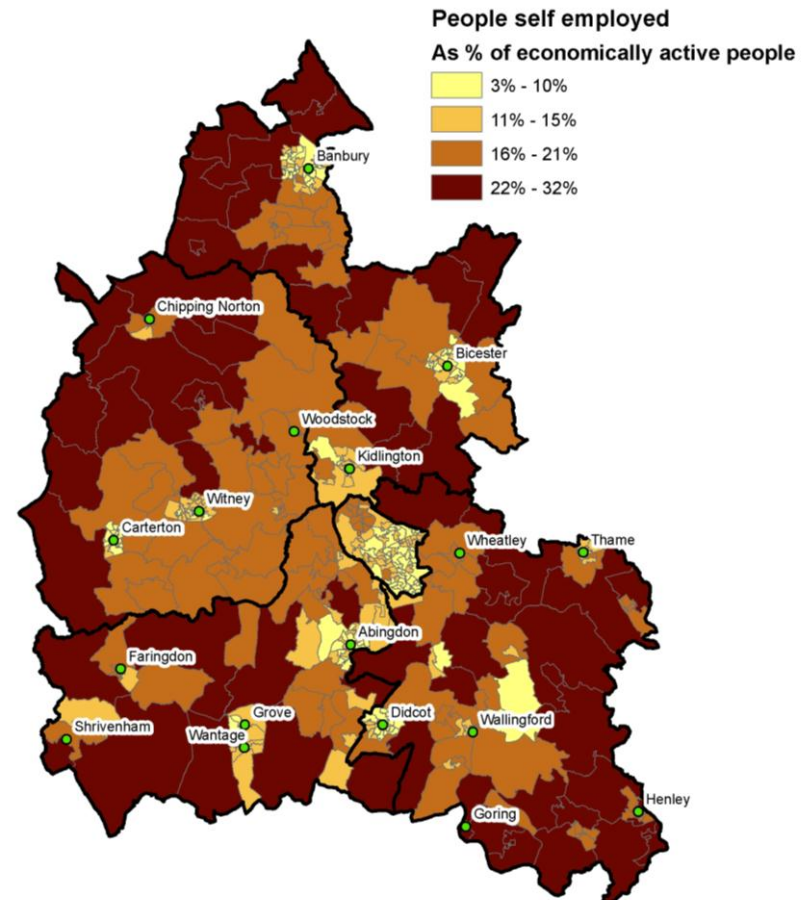
The Census 2011 survey shows that, as might be expected, levels of home working and self employment are highest in the more rural areas of Oxfordshire.

**Notes**

- ❖ Data is mapped to Lower layer Super Output Area level. LSOA is an ONS-defined “statistical geography” and typically include around 1,500 residents.
- ❖ Data has not yet been released on occupation of home workers or self employed – this will be the subject of future analysis.
