

Working hours: large increase in men working part-time

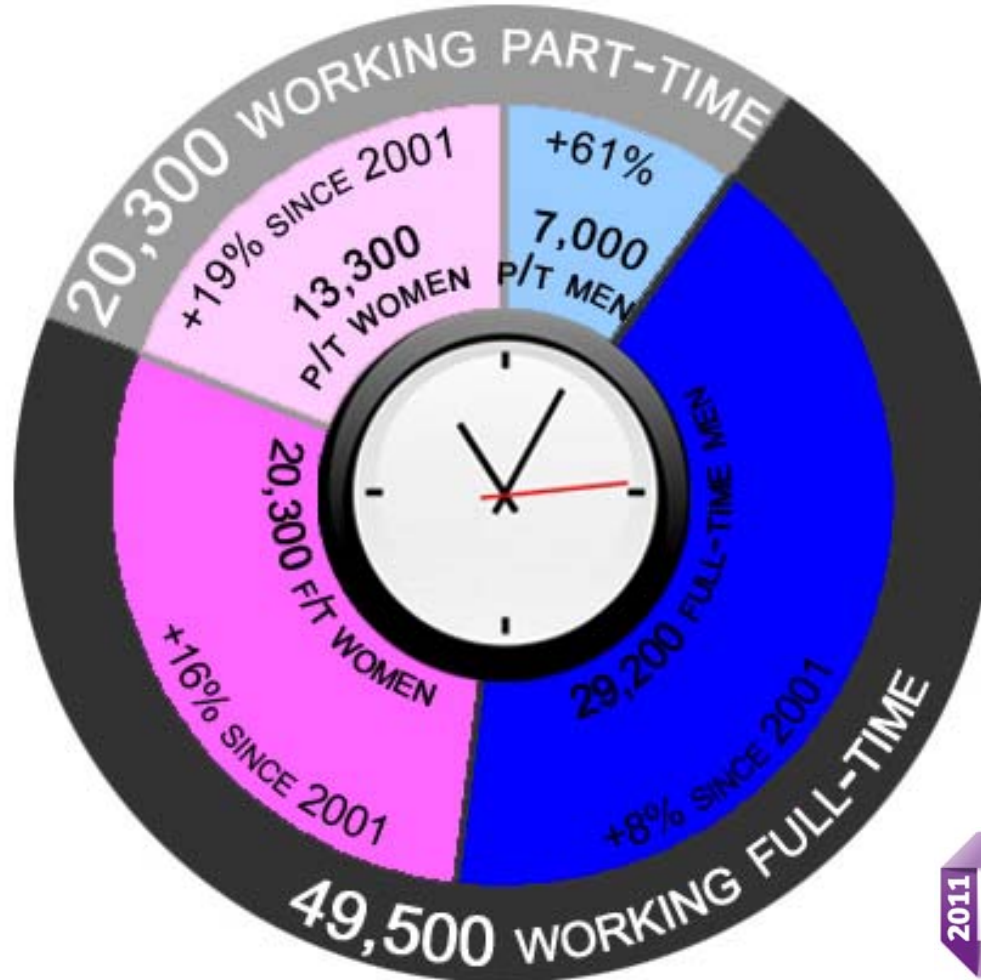
Between 2001 and 2011 the number of Oxford residents in employment increased from 60,000 to 70,000.

There was an increase in the number of men and women working both part-time and full-time. The largest increase was amongst men working part-time, growing by 61% over the decade. A similar change was seen across the rest of England. It remains to be seen whether this is an effect of the recession or a permanent shift in working patterns.

Despite this change, in 2011 women were still more likely than men to be working part-time.

Part-time: 30 hours or less per week
Full-time: 31 hours or more per week
