

Households (composition, size, and deprivation dimensions) and residents in communal establishments in Oxford

As part of the latest Census release on demography and migration, data on household composition, household size, household by deprivation dimensions and residents in communal establishments has been published by the Office for National Statistics (ONS). Household composition is the classification of households according to the relationships of the members of the household. Household size is equal to the number of usual residents in the household. Households by deprivation dimensions classifies households according to four dimensions of deprivation: Employment, education, health and disability, and household overcrowding. A communal establishment is defined as an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. Please note that this Census release does not include a breakdown of each communal establishment. This summary report includes an overview of Census 2021 household composition, size, deprivation dimensions, and numbers of communal establishment for Oxford City district as well as a comparison to 2011 data. Key findings:

- According to the 2021 Census, there are approximately 55,238 households in Oxford.
- In terms of household composition, the largest group of households in Oxford City is 'Single family households' (30,517).
- The second largest group in Oxford is 'One person household' (16,096), followed by Couple family "Other household types' (8,625).
- In terms of change over the last 10 years, the largest increase was experienced in 'Single family households' (+2,457 or +5%).
- The largest decrease in households was experienced in 'One person household' (-2,220 or -4%).
- In terms of household size, the largest number of households belong to the group of households with 2 residents (17,088 households), followed by households with 1 residents (16,096 households). This pattern has changed since 2011 where the largest group was households with 1 resident.
- In terms of household deprivation, over half of the households in Oxford (28,832) do not experience any dimension of deprivation, this is 4% higher (better) than in 2011.
- Just under a third of the households in Oxford experience at least 1 dimension of deprivation (1,767 residents), this has remained the same since 2011.
- Approximately 0.3% of households in Oxford experienced all 4 dimensions of deprivation. This is lower (better) than Census 2011 figures.
- There are 21,222 residents in communal establishments in 2021, 2,557 more than in 2011 (18,665).
