

UK armed forces veterans in Oxford in 2021

As part of the latest census release, for the first time, the ONS has published data on UK armed forces veterans. This dataset shows the number and proportion of UK armed forces veterans that are usual residents in Oxford compared to England. In addition to this, veteran figures will be grouped by type of service, living arrangements, number of veterans living in household compared to the national average, and household reference person by service type. Key findings:

- According to the 2021 Census, there were 2,474 armed force veterans¹ living in Oxford, making up 2% of the usual resident population aged 16 years and over. This is lower than both the county and national averages, (both at 4%).
- Compared to the rural districts, Oxford City has the lowest number of UK armed forces veterans living in Oxfordshire.
- In terms of living arrangements, 93% of veterans (2,303) live in households while the remaining 7% (171) live in communal establishments.
- Oxford has a higher proportion of veterans living in communal establishments (7%) compared to county (3%) and national averages (2%).
- There were 2,210 households in Oxford with at least one resident who previously served in the UK armed forces. This represents 4% of the total households in the city. This is lower than the county (8%) and national averages (7%).
- In terms of household reference person, there were 1,655 households (3%) in Oxford where the household reference person served either in regular UK armed forces, UK reserve armed forces or both. This is lower than the county and national averages (both at 6%).

¹ Armed forces veterans are defined as those who have previously served in regular UK armed forces, reserve UK armed forces, or both.
