

Country of birth and passports held

As part of the Census 2021 topic summary publication schedule, the ONS has just published figures on migration. These figures include country of birth and passports held. Country of birth refers to the categorisation of usual residents based on the country where they were born. Country of birth is subdivided by region and also goes down to country in some cases. The passports held indicator classifies usual residents by single passport. In cases where a person recorded has more than one passport, they were categorised in the following priority order: 1. UK passport, 2. Irish passport, 3. other passport. Where, European totals have been calculated, UK figures have been removed. Key findings:

- A higher proportion of Oxford residents were born overseas compared to 2011 (up 7%), with 65% of Oxford residents born in the UK in 2021 compared to 72% in 2011.
- In terms of country of birth the largest non-British group is made up of residents born in India with 3,601 (+1,117 from the previous Census), followed closely by the United States with 3,070 (+475 from the previous Census).
- Other countries included in the top 10 are Poland (2,773), China (2,565), Pakistan (2,558) and Scotland (2,041).
- At regional level, Europe (both EU and non EU countries) is at the top with 22,783 residents, followed by Middle East and Asia (19,233), the Americas and the Caribbean (7,516), Africa (5,715) and Antarctica and Oceania (1,335). Residents born in Europe saw the biggest increase of all regions since 2011 up 3%.
- Data on passports held show that the largest passport holder group comes from Portugal with 3,467 passport holders (up from 891 in 2011), followed by Poland with 2,831 (down slightly from 2,595 in 2011) and Italy with 2,509 (up from 1,244 in 2011).
- The largest regional group of passport holders in 2021 (after those residents who hold a UK passport) remains EU passport holders at 22,317; up from 14,685 in the previous Census.
- The number of non-EU (European) passports has increased slightly from 1,262 in 2011 to 1,505 in 2021.


