Please remove SP 13 from the proposed Oxford Plan 2040. A development here in the middle of the Conservation Area would be extremely detrimental to the community. I list some reason against the development:

1. Meadow Lane is designated a Quiet Route. Many people use it daily for walking, cycling and jogging. These numbers are greatly increased at the week-ends when whole families are out walking.

2. A development here will change the nature of the Lane itself. Resurfacing will cause the loss of green verges and hedgerows and the wildlife therein; all that make it a village lane.

3. The no car policy within the development will cause parking problems in Church Way which is the winding narrow road which carries all traffic to and from the village - it being a cul-de-sac.

4. The village needs the green field now, more than ever since there is so much development in and around Oxford and indeed further along Meadow Lane there is proposed development. The destruction of a green field is the destruction of wildlife. The fields are lungs and we need to breathe.

5. The Council is an elected body and should listen to the wishes of the electorate, not go blindly forward following its own agenda. There was considerable opposition to this development yet here it is still on the Proposed Oxford Plan 2040. I urge you to remove it.
