Re: East West Railway Company Limited Representation on the Oxford Local Plan 2045: Proposed Submission (Regulation 19) Consultation

Introduction

This response to Oxford City Council on the Oxford Local Plan 2045: Proposed Submission (Regulation 19) Consultation is submitted on behalf of East West Railway Company Limited (EWR Co). EWR Co is the organisation responsible for delivering East West Rail (EWR), a nationally significant rail project aiming to deliver both new and enhanced rail infrastructure to provide frequent, fast, and reliable rail links for communities between Oxford, Milton Keynes, Bedford, and Cambridge. The response builds on comments made by EWR Co in response to previous iterations of the draft local plan; namely, the 2040 draft local plan issues and options consultation in 2021, the Regulation 18 consultation in 2022 and the Regulation 19 consultation in 2024.

On the 14th November 2024 EWR Co commenced its third round of non-statutory consultation (NSC3) on the EWR project. The consultation period ran until the 24th January 2025. Details of the consultation can be found on EWR Co's [consultation webpages](#). The purpose of this non-statutory consultation was to obtain feedback on the early project designs, including areas where EWR Co was considering options.

Over 6,200 responses were received to NSC3 containing more than 90,000 individual pieces of feedback. In May 2025 EWR Co published a summary of how the consultation was delivered and the themes from the feedback received. In November 2025 EWR Co published "[You Said, We Did](#)" (YSWD) which explains how feedback from NSC3 is helping inform decisions on the project and outlining the project's next steps.



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Safeguarding Directions

On the 14th November 2024 the Secretary of State for Transport issued safeguarding directions to local authorities, including Oxford City Council, to protect the land required for the EWR project from conflicting development. Under the safeguarding directions local planning authorities must consult EWR Co on any application for planning permission, prior to its determination, falling within the “Limits of Land subject to Safeguarding Direction” as shown on plans annexed to the safeguarding directions. EWR Co also produced guidance for local planning authorities setting out how it expects the safeguarding directions should be implemented and administered. Paragraphs 24-29 of the guidance explain how the safeguarding directions should be taken into account in the preparation of local plans. The Council was issued copies of the safeguarding directions and accompanying guidance on the 14th November 2024.

On 19th November 2025, the Secretary of State issued updated safeguarding directions to reflect changes to the project boundary to ensure that the safeguarded land aligns with EWR Co’s latest proposals. The Council was issued copies of the updated safeguarding directions and accompanying guidance on the 19th November 2025.

The Council is advised that there are likely to be further changes to the safeguarding boundary in the period up to the submission of the DCO application and the Council will notified of these changes in the same way as described above.

Consultation Response

As stated in its response to the 2042 Regulation 18 draft local plan consultation in August 2025, EWR Co welcomes references in the draft local plan to the transformational role that EWR will bring to the city of Oxford through increasing accessibility of the city to a wider workforce across the Oxford to Cambridge area. It also supports proposals in policies S1 and S3 which seek to positively pursue sustainable development and ensure that new development is focussed on areas with opportunities for sustainable travel links and are easy to reach by walking, cycling and public transport.

These aspirations to achieve sustainable development and improve accessibility across the city by improving opportunities for walking, cycling and the use of public transport are also included in the ‘Area of Focus’ policies which are also supported.

In its August 2025 consultation response, EWR Co drew particular attention to draft allocations (carried forward from the previous adopted local plan) in the Northern Edge of Oxford and the West End and Botley Road Areas of Focus which are also carried forward into this draft local plan. EWR Co suggested that the wording for these policy allocations should reflect the potential for an interaction between development on these sites and EWR and that this must be taken into account by those bringing forward development proposals on these sites. In particular these comments referred to allocations which are

now allocated under Policy SPCW9 – Oxford Railway Station and Becket Street Car Park, Policy SPCW10 – Oxpens and Policy SPN5 – Pear Tree Farm.

EWB Co welcomes the changes that have been made to these policies which now reflect the provisions of the EWB safeguarding directions and contain new text to ensure that planning permission involving land safeguarded for EWB within the three allocated sites is not granted “...until the East West Rail Company has been consulted and the procedure set out in the East West Rail Safeguarding Directions has been followed (**Policy I2**).”

135.1 Policy I2 sound

EWB Co is also pleased to see that the Council has identified the route and extent of the EWB Safeguarding through the draft local plan area on the Policies Map and the inclusion of Policy I2 – Safeguarding Land For Infrastructure in the draft local plan, criterion b of which notes that “Planning permission involving land safeguarded for East West Rail (Oxford) will not be granted until the East West Rail Company has been consulted and the procedure set out in the East West Rail Safeguarding Directions (or the requirements of any future equivalent or consenting legislation) has been followed.”

As noted above, there are likely to be further changes to the safeguarding boundary in due course and the Council should continue to update the Policies Map to reflect any future safeguarding directions, or revisions to the safeguarding directions prior to the adoption of the local plan.

Policy SPN5 – Pear Tree Farm

[N.B says no objection, but a change is requested, so marked as a soundness comment]
135.2 Policy SPN5 Unsound c.effective

EWB Co wishes to make one new comment on the draft local plan in respect of Policy SPN5 which introduces a new requirement which was not contained in the equivalent policies in previous iterations of the draft local plan. This current policy wording contains a new criterion q which requires the layout and design of the site to “facilitate and not compromise the delivery of walking, cycling, and wheeling access through the site, over the footbridge across the railway line to Oxford Parkway station.”

Whilst EWB Co does not object to this requirement, it wishes to make clear that the provision of this walking, wheeling and cycling access through and beyond the site to Oxford Parkway Station is not within the remit of the EWB project. Accordingly, if it is to be delivered, it must be in conjunction with the development of this site. There should be no reliance on EWB Co to deliver this link.

EWB Co looks forward to continuing to work collaboratively and positively with the City Council on the Local Plan as it evolves and through the process towards examination and adoption.
